with her Sister - She said when Shanghee
returned from the war he would be very
angry if Mr Kendall was gone away,
and that he would not allow the mission-
aries to live at Kiddee Kiddee - I replied if
Shanghee did not wish the missionaries to
live at his place, I would send a ship
and take them to Port Jackson and that
the missionaries did not come to New
Zealand for any thing that they had
to give them - for they had plenty of
provisions and cloths in their own
country - I appealed to her Husband &
brother who ^{both} had lived with me
if we had not plenty of every thing
in Port Jackson and did not want
any thing from them - which they
admitted
